


Salamu Alaykum:

The end of term 1 is upon us. It has been a great term with lots of learning and fun. Learning Conferences were a great showcase for all that has been happening. If you didn't make it to these, then Kaiako (teachers) will be in contact with you to make a time to see and hear about the wonderful learning of your tamariki. We are always wanting to improve, so if you have any feedback for us about the learning conference please let us know through email, either to Melanie, Jo, Amanda or your child's Kaiako.

Ramadan starts this week, Happy Ramadan to you all. There is a space in Onepū Rua for tamariki who are fasting and wish to pray at morning tea and lunch. All are welcome.

Keep an eye out for notifications for any Timely Reporting for your tamariki on HERO. There are a few comments that have been published and you should get a notification for them. Our vision is for you to receive timely, authentic, rich information for you about your tamariki. You have the ability to comment on the posts that are there too. By the end of term 2 tamariki will have four published posts, reading, writing, maths and ako. At the end of term 2 there will also be a post sharing the curriculum level your child is currently working at in reading, writing and maths. Curriculum levels are nationally based around year groups. In general, Yrs 1-2 work at Curriculum Level 1, Yrs 3-4 at Curriculum Level 2 and Yrs 5-6 at Curriculum Level 3. Of course. as you know, tamariki learn at different rates so they could be working at different curriculum levels for different learning areas. You will see in the graph that there is no definitive finish, the line fades gradually in both directions, so there may be tamariki who are working at a different curriculum level to others in their year group.


