Update from Board of Trustees

Our 2nd Board meeting for this term was on Monday the 20th of June. The Behaviour Management Policy was up for review as part of our regular cycle and we discussed this in some detail. We use a system/website called SchoolDocs to manage our policy documents and to regularly review them. You can access School Docs from your Hero Account. The username for the community is lyallbay and the password is maranui. We encourage you to please visit the site and have a look at the policies. Any and all feedback is welcome. The next item on the agenda was our election planning. The school Board Elections are in September this year. We have selected our Returning Officer and you can expect to hear a bit more about the Board Elections in the coming weeks. We will be calling for nominations soon. If you think you might be interested in being a part of the Board, we encourage you to come along to our next Board meetings to see what is involved. The Board also reviewed the achievement data for the target learners. It was great to hear of the progress that has been made across the school. The adaptive practices being used to try to accelerate student achievement were discussed. One group that has some extra focus is the year two cohort. These akongā have had a disruptive start to their schooling with COVID having been a factor throughout their school journey. The strategies being put in place to support these students were discussed and the work that our Kaiako are doing to support these students is evident. We discussed the wellbeing of students and staff and would like to thank the Friends of Lyall Bay for the work they have been doing to help convert the former dental clinic into a useable space to support students. The final point of discussion was the Principal's Report, covering Finance, Health and Safety, and our renovations. The renovation of the Ahu block is getting underway soon. We discussed some of the disruptions this will bring to the school and the mitigations that have been put in place around this. Our next meeting is scheduled for Monday the 8th of August at 7pm in the staffroom. Our meetings are open to our community to attend.

SEA LEVEL RISE AND THE SOUTH COAST

SAVE THE DATE

KIA ORA SOUTH COASTERS

The release of the New Zealand SeaRise project report has injected real urgency into climate change adaptation for coastal communities. Come and hear directly from the authors of this report and the Climate Change Minister James Shaw.

Hear about our Wellington sea floor dropping and our sea level rising at a combined rate of double previous estimates. This means the threat to our coastal communities, roading, and other infrastructure is looming fast and will have serious impacts on access to insurance, mortgages, resale and most importantly, human health and safety and long term viability. Two swell warnings in the space of a week in May this year are a stark reminder of the challenges we face as coastal communities.

ACTION IS REQUIRED

Residents associations from Owhiro Bay, Island Bay, Houghton Bay, Lyall Bay, Moa Point and Breaker Bay, and other community groups, such as Guardians of the Bay, working together as the Coastal Climate Change Coalition, have collaborated to host a meeting where you, the coastal community. This korero will be the first steps in our push for a coastal adaptation and mitigation strategy for the South Coast of Wellington.
